British Government established a Board of Economic Inquiry in India in the year 1919 to undertake evidence-based policy research on different socio-economic issues including Agriculture and Rural Economy. After the partition in 1947, the organization was renamed as Board of Economic Inquiry, West Pakistan. In 1975, it was reorganized as Economic Research Institute and in 1980 it was reactivated as Punjab Economic Research Institute (PERI) with the status of Autonomous Body of the Planning and Development Board. Therefore, it is the oldest economic research institution in the country with an unbroken record of economic research going back to 1919.







### **Exploratory Analysis of Road Traffic Accidents in Punjab (2015-2019)**

The global impact road traffic accidents (RTAs) is underscored, with 1.35 million deaths in 2016, primarily affecting the 5-29 age group. Despite 90% of fatalities occurring in low and middle-income countries, the economic toll reaches 5% of GDP. The study focuses Pakistan. where RTAs ranked ninth in causes of death in 2016, constituting 3% of total deaths. It analyzes RTAs in Punjab from 2015 to 2019, revealing 1.4 million incidents, 1.6 million victims, and over 17 thousand fatalities, primarily involving motorcycles and human errors. The report urges urgent policy interventions, emphasizing the need for safer road environments Punjab.

### Analysis of the carpet industry in Pakistan: A special focus on Punjab

The carpet industry in the subcontinent, tracing back to the 11th century Mughal era, has evolved, with Pakistan specializing labor-intensive hand-knotted carpets. While knotted carpet demand declined from 21% in 2001 to 5.8% in 2019, tufted and woven carpets comprise now 79.67% of demand. Despite knotted carpets dominating exports with a 92% share, global trends show a shift to tufted carpets. Pakistan faces challenges such as declining global market share, concentrated industry locations, and issues like child labor and health hazards. Government initiatives aim to support the industry, but recommendations stress the need for adapting to changing global demand, leveraging existing programs, updating training, and seeking international exposure.



### Diversification in Punjab's Agriculture; A District Level Approach

Punjab's agriculture sector, thriving due to favorable conditions and accessible inputs, faces sustainability challenges outlined in the economic survey. With a population set to exceed 229 million by 2022, feeding the growing populace is a concern.

Diversification, proposed as a strategy, involves horizontal (multiple cropping) vertical and (incorporating activities like livestock rearing). District-wise diversification levels in Punjab are identified, emphasizing the need for targeted policies bottom-up and approach to ensure inclusive and sustainable agricultural development, aligning with several Sustainable Development Goals.

### A study on Gender Roles and related work burden and their effects on Child Labor in Agriculture in Punjab

The study delves into daily life realities in key cottonproducing districts Punjab, considering gender differences in labor division. Focusing on child labor and its gender impact, it explores family labor dynamics, resource use, and gender relations in small communities. farm Highlighting the invisibility gender roles quantitative assessments. the research aims to provide insight into the lives and informal networks of these communities. It emphasizes the agricultural system's lack of inclusivity, exposing challenges such as child labor, gender-based and limited constraints, access to information and resources. The study advocates for a holistic understanding of small farm families' contributions and challenges, addressing disparities gender decision-making and work allocation within households.



## Baseline Survey of National Programme for Enhancing Profitability Through Increasing Productivity of Rice

sector The agriculture remains a significant contributor to Pakistan's economy, despite declining share in GDP. Challenges such as climate change, water scarcity, and pest attacks have hindered optimal productivity. The government's "Prime Minister Agriculture Programme" Emergency aims to revitalize the sector with a focus on rice farming, particularly in Punjab. The initiative includes mechanized transplanting, addressing issues like inefficient land use and low adoption of modern farming practices. A study involving 393 rice growers highlights challenges like illiteracy, traditional practices, and limited access agricultural machinery. The Rice Research Institute plays a role in introducing varieties, training new farmers, and allocating budgets efficiently. The Agricultural Extension's vital role in promoting sustainable farming practices is emphasized, revealing the need increased awareness and knowledge dissemination among farmers.
